This race in the BBC's calendar always has a plentiful amount of birds entered with 1,856 birds being sent by 206 members. With only a handful of members not bothering to verify their first bird it shows what type of race it was. It made a pleasant change to have a weather forecast predicted which didn't mean having a holdover. Nigel telephoned me at 6am on Saturday to say everything looked good to go and due to the west in the wind forecast to be increasing in the channel he was going to liberate at 6.15am which he did. Thank you as always to all the marking stations and all the helpers for your hard work especially on this race with so many birds to mark in such a short time. Please could all members make sure their clock is cleared from all old races before coming to the marking station as it holds the marking up for other members. Thank you.

Many congratulations to one man who still cannot be beaten even when he is not 100% fit himself is our Fougeres OB race winner **1st Open 1st Section D Roger Lowe from Reading.**

I did not expect to do so well as I have not been too well myself lately. The 1st bird a yearling blue hen all ready a winner of 1st Club 6th Fed 2,236 birds and 59th Section 850 birds, 123rd Open 1,904 birds BICC Guernsey is bred from "Rocky" who is sire of many good birds a De Raw Sablon bred by F & J Vandenheede and the dam "Lady Jane" a direct Daniel Aerens who's dam is the 5th ace pigeon over five seasons from International Barcelona PIPA rankings.

Sending 23 birds, 16 widowhood cocks and 7 widowhood hens and having 22 home on the day it turned out to be a very good day.

I would just like to thank Mark Gilbert for not sending and thanks for a good race.



Another name who is always at the top is **Pete Wells from Dunstable 2nd Open 2nd Section D.**

Pigeon is a yearling blue chequer pied hen. The sire is a son of Dave Albon's Midlands National Winner from Tours and the Dam is a daughter of Les Jones NFC Bordeaux winner "Joe".

3rd Open is Don Green from Monks Risborough. It came as a great surprise to get a phone call from Clare this afternoon informing me that I was probably 3rd Open and asked if I could write a small piece.

Well I first joined the BBC in 1997 and in my very first race finished 4th Open from the Rennes y/b race. I went to the prize giving night at Bournemouth to pick up Bucks cup, me and my wife were seated at a table with the late great Kenny Hines and his family, Colin Kinnersley and Geoff and a very young Mark Gilbert, (may I say that really is the nearest I have ever got to Mark)!!!! Will always remember Kenny saying "Enjoy the walk as its not easy to get a walk to the prize table". How true that is with so many top class fanciers competing, none more so than our race winner Roger Lowe a great win and my congratulations go to you Roger "Enjoy the walk Mate", also to my fellow Fed members Pete Wells who is 2nd Open and Mick Carrick with a handful just behind myself to take 4th, 5th, 6th & 7th Open.

Well I was lucky enough to win the San Sebastian race with the BBC in 2005 and have always focused on the distance races. I left the sport for some years due to moving back to London and restarted again about 3 years ago. I decided to try and get some birds that could fly a bit faster than my own from the shorter races, this led me to a trip up to the Midlands to purchase birds from Ken Lycett, which in turn led to me meeting their son Mike who now is a great friend. He has helped me acquire birds from Gordon Bros and McGimpsey Bros in Ireland, leading to me winning more Fed cards in the last 18 months than I had got in the last 38 years. He also advises me on the best ways to manage and race these birds, so a big thank you Mike.

The Blue Widowhood cock "all pooler" that came in this race is a Vandenabeele bred from a Gordon Bros cock x Saffron 222 bred by myrtle lofts. He has been very consistent for me over the past few weeks without actually winning, he was my first bird from the Messac race with NFC a few weeks back which was a really tough affair where he homed with mud up to his wing butts looking very sorry for himself.

May I also say a big thanks to all the people at Walkern Sports, having given a hand at marking on Thursday it made me realise how much these people do, I myself got there at 9.30 and got home at 4.30 and they were still there

clearing up, so to Mike & Edna Shepherd, Dick Burgin and the other guys there!!! You really are appreciated, (oh and nice coffee Edna) Thanks!!!

Mark & Clare Brown from Woodland St Mary are 1st Section C. Firstly congratulations to Roger Lowe and Peter wells two top fanciers who are always at the top of the results and whose birds I put through at Hungerford marking station so I knew what condition they were in, also Mick Carrick on a great team performance.

Our section winner came well on the day and was racing hard, he is a chequer pied yearling cock racing to a 7 day yb in the nest, he is a Gaby Vandenabeele x Koopman/Van dyke who we call "nobby" due to his character. He has scored minor prizes and 1st 3b Portland earlier in the season.

We were confident of a good season this year with our team of mainly yearlings which flew superbly as youngsters but in truth our season has been terrible really, after it started off brilliantly with 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th Club 3rd, 4th, 6th, 8th Federation Portland and then 33rd/35th Open BBC National Coutances and 32nd Open BICC National Falaise at the end of April, but then went down hill fast.

Each week after getting good returns but we were a constant 15/30mins behind the winners of Club and Nationals thereafter.... Well I tried altering things as I knew deep down something was not right they were not that bad, but to no avail, even the week before this race I sent 6 to Messac (251miles) which returned in some of the worst weather, rain, hail and thunder/lightning storms I have ever witnessed, result 6 home from 6 sent but again 30mins behind the winners....

Well I racked my brains but couldn't find the solution, I was speaking to our friend Aaron Haines from Cheltenham and thrashed things out, canker, cocci, respiratory, fungal but to no avail. He rang me back later and asked did I use a hose pipe when filling the drinkers to which I said yes, could be bacteria, Well ding that triggered something that I hadn't done before, and something I hadn't spotted as I'd been too busy looking at the corns etc (also makes sense looking back due to the fact another mate Keith Palmer, always has a crack with me each week we send to the Watchfield club as our birds simply rush to the drinkers on the baskets, he says "hey Brownny have they had the water switched off again at your place", lol) poor birds must have known that water was clean, ours must have been swimming with bugs of which you couldn't see!!!

Well that Sunday morning I scrubbed/cleaned the drinkers and set about cleansing the birds Sunday pm Monday and Tuesday am and then built them back up again ready for this weeks races, well it must have worked because our chequer pied cock "nobby" came like a train from Fougères to record provisional 1st section 10th Open National and

our other two timings being potentially 7th and 12th Section so that was pleasing, we also had a Club race from Kingsdown on the same day which resulted in one of our yearling hens winning 1st Club and with decent quick and full returns, we did also send 5 hens to Saintes NFC but looking back I don't think we had enough time to rebuild these before their 400mile trip but we did however get a yearling red hen home (paired to the section winner) when I got home from the Club on Saturday evening at 8pm, she was on her baby and another at 6.30am next morning so can't really complain.

So here's looking forward now to the any age and old hen races with the BICC, BBC and NFC.

The Heremans Ceusters bloodlines coming from a Cock bird bought at the CSCFC Late bred sale donated by Gordon Emm from Salisbury.

They have raced brilliantly for me all season and I could have just raced these two and nothing else as they fly really well. These are the best I have had for years. I don't race hens only widowhood cocks. I start the season racing probably the first three Club races and then just the Nationals and Classics.
