Thurso National 1st Open 1st Section J Micky Sontag & Son from Harlow With "Katie"

The British Barcelona Club's Old Bird season was put to bed with the long trip North to Thurso. Our convoyer Pat said he had never been that far in to Scotland before and what some amazing and beautiful sites to see on the way to the top of Scotland, it is well worth a visit.

From the 576 birds entered by 83 members 273 birds were cross nominated from the CSCFC. Between the two clubs there were 666 birds liberated on Friday 13th July at 5am.

Race Advisors Report: Liberation was at 5am in a light SW wind with the sun up and clear sky.

The weather is forecast to be good for the whole of the route with almost unbroken sunshine. The breeze for the first 100 to 150 miles is from the South West starting moderate but lighter as they travel south through Scotland and coming more from the West. It then comes light and at times variable mainly from the North West or North as they travel into and down through England. Temperatures will peak in the upper 20's in late afternoon.

Thank you to all the marking stations for all your hard work through the old bird season. At least you have a few weeks off now before the young bird races. Thank you to Clive and Jill Rogers and Clive Merrills for very kindly ferrying the Frome and Hungerford birds to Southampton and also thanks to Pete Gretton and Paul Baker for religiously no matter how many birds making the trip from Brighton to Southampton.

Many congratulations to our Thurso winner **Micky Sontag & Son of Harlow 1**st **Open 1**st **Section J.** Congratulations to all those that timed on the day. Firstly, I would like to thank Cecil and Mark Bulled, for giving me the opportunity to race their unique family of pigeons that have been winning from Thurso and other distance events since I started keeping pigeons as a boy. I am now a recently retired 66 year old!! The old Harlow club had such strong characters which have instilled in me the value of racing in the premier events.

I have raced now south for the past 10 years, but with the situation of no channel racing I decided to turn my team North

My Winning 3 year old hen, now named "Katie" flew Bordeaux as a 2 year old and has always been consistent scoring minor positions. This year she was trained North to Peterborough, but then went back South first race to Blandford when it looked like channel racing might open. She then went on to fly Wadebridge twice before being turned back North back where she had 3 races North to Blaydon 230miles. She was previously raced Widowhood before being paired for Thurso sent sitting 12 days eggs. She had a 40 mile toss north 3 days prior to basketing. Her breeding is 100% Bulled bloodline, being a Grand daughter of Mark's Champion Legacy. I'm lucky to have 5 direct children of Legacy in my stock loft as Mark gives me his last round of eggs at the end of each season. Winning a National, is a life times' ambition and this win will take a while to sink in.

Runner up in **Section D** to Mark and **8th Open is Owen Abery of Theale.** I sent 2 birds to Thurso out of a possible 3 candidates to pick from that had raced Ilkeston, Blaydon, and Berwick. The birds had been rested since Berwick just loft exercised and fed appropriately for the job in hand.

I fancied the little blue hen, her breeding is a Mark Gilbert distance pigeon. The sire was gifted to Roger Lowe from Mark Gilbert, after a year of him owning it I was offered the cock by Roger as he knew all my birds were distances pigeons gifted to me by Mark. I paired him to a hen bred down from Southfield Supreme. As a baby my hen only had 4 club races then as yearling had 4 races furthest being Truro taking 3rd club being beaten by loft mates. This year she had 2 club races north followed by 2 club races south. She was my 5th bird back CSCFC Ilkeston then Blaydon was 200th open BBC, and Berwick CSCFC was 9th sec 73rd open, and BBC was 14th sec 89th open. This Little hen really handled well when she went to the race, I hoped I had her and my other entry in the right condition to fly just over 500 mile. She was in brilliant condition when she returned and virtually the same as how I sent her, she had flown 12 hrs 21 min and I was on cloud 9 that I had clocked from Thurso.

2nd Section B Mark and Julie Gower of Fordingbridge. Congratulations to the race winner Mr Sontag & Son and my club mate Jim Fulford.

I made a decision early this year to gently race my distance yearlings and 2 year olds on the north route up to Berwick for the 2 year olds and Leicester with the yearlings. This left 14x 3 & 4 year olds that had flown Pau last season, they were prepared with 3 short north races and then to Blaydon with the Classic. After Blaydon I had two that were injured through attacks and 2 were lost so the 12 were left to rest and grow new feathers.

They were exercised around home for the following 4 weeks and given a 60 mile race from Honiton 2 weeks before Thurso, they were only exercised once a day as I have an issue with a Goshawk around home and this has made the birds very jumpy and often they would become loft shy and difficult to get them back in the loft.

My first bird is a 3 year old hen that took 4 days to come back from Pau last year but this year she did not put a foot wrong, she is bred from my good friend Andy Parsons stock being from birds that have been to Tarbes 8 times and a daughter of his great stock cock "Dancer".

My second bird is 3 year old hen bred from Nick Adshead stock and she was my first bird last year from Pau finishing 63^{rd} open and was my fancied pigeon this year, the 3^{rd} was a 4 year old hen was a from Frieldenhoffen stock and she was my 3^{rd} pigeon from Pau last year.

My final pigeon clocked on the day was a 4 year old hen from the same blood as my first pigeon.

All my birds remained un-paired this year although they did start to pair together lately and were fed on Countrywide corn.

I would like to finish by saying a big thank you to good friends Nick Smith & Andy Parsons for always helping me by taking the birds to marking when they can, and to Julie my wife with help with the birds.

1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th & 5th Section A Kevin and John Zerafa of Portsmouth. Firstly can we congratulate the overall winner Micky Sontag and all of the Section winners. Also congratulations to everyone that timed on the day, as it's never easy at the distance. We are still beaming with how well our birds performed and it was the first time my father has been able to get out in the garden since he was discharged from hospital following a bad chest and lung infection, so just what the doctor ordered for him! We were both buzzing when we timed on the day and to take the fist 5 positions in the Section was just magical!

Our first bird, which was the only bird timed on the day into Section A, is provisionally 1st Section, 14th Open flying 547 miles. He is bred out of a son of The House of Aarden's "Padfield's Blue Badge" who is also a G/Son of New Laureaat & Kleine Jade (both 1st International Barcelona). The dam of our first bird was bred by Dean Childs of Wickford and is a daughter of "Chalice Olive" 6th BICC National Agen. He was sent sitting a 4 day old youngster and was 1st Fed from Wetherby (217 miles) a few weeks previous.

Our second bird which was timed early next morning was spotted by myself on the camera walking round the garden whilst I was indoors making my father some breakfast. When we checked the playback he'd been walking around the garden for 13 minutes, but luckily for us his Section (2nd) or Open (22nd) position wasn't affected! He isn't really bred for long distance racing, but was tried at Pau NFC last season and finished 90th Open, being timed early on the second day. For this race he was sent sitting 5 day eggs. His sire was 1st Open NFC Saintes and is owned by our good friend Bill Edwards of Gosport and his dam is our NFC winner from Fougeres "Eastern Angel" who is starting to breed a few useful birds for us.

Our third bird which is provisionally 3rd Section, 27th Open was bred by Wearn & Neilson from a cock that we bought jointly from a Dutch fancier called Tim Hage and her dam is one of their own being bred down from "New Laureaat" & "Special One" lines. This hen has been a great racer for us in the BBC this year already being 5th Section 35th Open from Blaydon (288 miles) and 4th Section 19th Open from Berwick (345 miles). She was sent sitting 5 day old eggs.

Our fourth bird which is provisionally 4th Section 37th Open was bred out of a son of Mark Gilbert's "Southfield Supreme Junior" and was sent to the race celibate as his hen was lost at Elgin. His Dam is a daughter of Dean Childs's "Chalice King" (who has sired two BICC winners), when he was paired to his own daughter "Chalice Darcy" 1st BICC Mont de Marsan (Pau).

Our fifth bird which is provisionally 5th Section 44th Open was bred out of a son of our good hen "Chich" who won for us 7th Open Pau CSCFC, 1st Section 11th Open Narbonne BICC & 23rd Open St Vincent BICC when she was paired to Steve Harris' Bergerac CSCFC winner. The dam of our fifth bird was bred out of two BICC winners "Chalice Sidney" 1st BICC St Vincent and "Chalice Darcy" 1st BICC Mont de Marsan" both owned by Dean Childs of Wickford.

He is 100% Chris Hebberecht and is a 1/2 brother to many good pigeons including 5th Open BICC Nat Falaise 8,200 birds and 27th Nat BICC St Vincent, he is bred from a direct son of Talis 1st National La Soutteriane and his dam is Cathy, our top breeding daughter of Champion 2nd National Ace Pigeon KBDB Long Distance 2005 4th National Souillac 35517th National Cahors 9,275 birds, 50th National Souillac 5,985 birds 60th National Limoges 12,266 birds 80th National Brive 7,446 birds. "39" was flown on traditional widowhood and is fed of feeds and supplements from Beyers and Country Wide. It was a lovely moment when he landed, I was on the phone to my partner and friend Rob Brooks from High Littleton who has been a great help in improving our long distance results as well as managing the team at High Littleton under the name Brooks Brothers & Wilcox.

Convoyers Report

Tuesday 13 July: Left Southampton at 2.30pm. Parked up for the night near Stoke-on-Trent, fed and watered birds. Wednesday 14 July: Left Stoke-on-Trent at 5am, stopped 3 times on route to give the birds a rest and water. Each stop was 1 hour. Got into Thurso at 6.15pm, fed and watered birds.

Thursday 15 July: Water in front of birds all day, topped up regularly. Gave birds a full feed at 12 noon. Moved into position at tea time ready for an early morning lib. Phoned Clive Merrills (Race Adviser) 7pm to talk about Friday's lib. He said to phone him at 4.30am but to have the transporter ready for a lib. **Friday 16 July**: Up at 3.30am (daylight in Thurso). Got transporter ready to lib. Phoned Clive at 4.30am, told him

Friday 16 July: Up at 3.30am (daylight in Thurso). Got transporter ready to lib. Phoned Clive at 4.30am, told him sun was popping its head over the horizon. The Old Man of Hoy was visible, as was the rest of the Orkney Islands 5 miles North of us. Told Clive it was OK to lib but we would hold on until 5am.

Birds liberated at 5am in a light SW wind. Birds left the site in one batch but broke in half about 2 miles south of the site. One half headed SSE but the rest went around a few times 2 miles South of us. After about 2 minutes this batch broke into 3 batches with 2 batches heading SSE and the other heading straight South. I looked at my phone to see how long it took all birds to be out of sight - it was 5.05am.

We would like to thank the 3 local fanciers David, Alastair and Terry who kept us company on Thursday evening and the same 3 lads turned out at 4.30am to watch the liberation.
