Wakefield Young Birds & Old Hens National

Young Bird Winner Chris Maddison of Boston Old Hens Winner P Basham of Southampton

Firstly, thank you to all our marking station I/C's, markers and helpers for all your hard work this season. You are the first port of call for our members to be able to send and without you volunteering we wouldn't have the marking stations. Thank you also to Pat and Steve our convoyers for taking so much care with the birds and also Roger Hurst for making the call every race day to liberate.

Our final race from Wakefield was going together with the Central Southern Classsic Flying Club. On board we have a combined total of just over 1000 young birds and old hens.

(Clive Merrills & Roger Hurst: Race Advisors) Liberation was at 8.30 in a strong Westerly breeze. The birds left the site without circling in one bunch.

There is a 35 to 45 mile sunny corridor for the birds to follow before the remainder of the route is forecast to be mostly cloudy skies with some sunny breaks, more as the day goes on. The wind is in the west at 10 mph. Visibility forecast is good to very good.

Many congratulations to our Young Bird and Old Hens Winners Chris Maddison and Paul Basham.

I cannot ever remember being speechless, that changed when Clare Norman called to congratulate us on winning 1st Open BBC YB National. This was our first National race after family commitments hindered us being able to send to Berwick or Thurso. We race as C & C Maddison, a father and son partnership although my father isn't active day to day with the pigeons any longer he retains an involvement, helps when I go away and is always only a call away for any help that may be needed. He was instrumental in helping us get started in the sport, financing it and keeping me accountable as best he could. Any success we have in the sport, including this National win is dedicated to him for his willingness, tolerance and support through the years.

My children maintain an interest though in the sport especially at breeding time and enjoy helping with training and are generally helpful with any chores that need doing especially the younger ones who haven't discovered computer games yet.

We have kept pigeons continuously since 1998 but only started racing again in 2020 after a long break. Our racing last year was from a 6ftx4ft garden shed with a small team of young birds. We enjoyed the simplicity of this but knew that more would be needed, a 24ft x 8ft Blakes loft and full set up was purchased from Mark Burton at Louth and a 28ft x 8ft loft was built by a local shed builder. The 24ft loft has been used for the old bird team and the 28ft has been used for the young birds and stock birds. The old bird loft is set up for 16 cocks and 16 hens. The 28ft loft is set up as a 22ft young bird section for 40 young birds and a 6ft stock section.

We don't keep a huge amount of pigeons and have no wish to do so; we like to keep our numbers maintainable to what we can manage.

The winner of the National was bred by Russ and Denise Skinner of Boston and was in a group of 10 young birds we had this year.

His dam is a winning daughter of 'Champion Rheedeem' who is a multiple prize winner at club, Fed and NRCC including winning the NRCC old bird averages and £1000 nomination on his own in 2019. The National winners sire is a grandson of 'Foxy lady' who was raced by Prince brothers and is now at Syndicate lofts.

The 2nd open National pigeon was bred by James Harvey of Stoke. James had to unfortunately stop racing and offered his entire YB team on the Facebook pigeon chat group as gifts. Arrangements were promptly made to collect the birds and they have performed well for us throughout the season and several will feature high up on the National result

His dam was bred by Roger Phillips from the lines of Mark Gilbert St Vincent national winner and Tarbes NFC winner

The sire was bred by Stuart Wilcox from the lines of Wilf Reeds NFC certificate of merit winner 'Darkie' when crossed with Mark Bulled 'Legacy' and 'Sgt Cecil' lines.

We are grateful to Russ, Denise and James for supplying us with quality young birds.

The young birds sent to the National had 6 races with the Peterborough fed up to Whitley Bay (154 miles) before being entered into the BBC and overall have performed consistently in the club and exceeding the expectations we had. The young birds are fed on VL Gerry plus with energy mix being fed on the last feed before the race. The birds are always fed to appetite. Product wise, spirulina powder with gempthax is used on the corn on the return from the race and naturline and Med tollyamin forte are used sparingly. Matrix and De Patagoon grit are always available. We have seen a notable improvement in our performances this young bird season, the main element we believe to this is using the local training service provided by local fancier Carl Upsall, this has allowed us to get good quality consistent training but has also made more time available to spend with the pigeons rather than rushing down the road before or after work.

I would like to congratulate all on the result, and thank Clare Norman and all at the Bovingdon marking station for making us feel so welcome and also the many friends who have taken the time to call or message.

I had a fantastic race with seven birds in two minutes. First a chequer hen bred by Griffiths and Jewkins of Banwen, South Wales which has been a consistent young bird. Second a dark chequer cock bred from a son of Mark Gilbert's Southfield Sebastian 1st National Falaise and 1st National Agen when paired to a dark chequer hen, a gift bird from Billy Greenaway (Jeff Greenaway's Dad) from Northern Ireland.

Next up in Section D Terry Haley of Watford. This blue bar hen was bred by myself. Positions so far are 4^{th} Club Wakefield last week beaten by two loft mates. She was my 2^{nd} bird with the BBBC Ilkeston race 2 weeks previously, and 2^{nd} Club Retford beaten by a loft mate for 1^{st} prize.

The Sire was also 4th Section in the BICC as a young bird, plus many more positions and the Dam was 1st section in the BICC in 2019 plus many other prizes.

The blue Chequer cock was my second pigeon bred by Bill Edward & Pat Harris of Gosport one of 6 that I purchased in March to try out. He was timed in at 11.27.36.

Well done to John Adams who has been flying a terrific team of young birds this season on the North Road.

Bovingdon marking station have faired very well this season with 3 different Section winners and 2 separate Open winners all sending from here.

1st Section A Rob Jones & Jamie Wells (Bartlett, Jones & Wells) of Southampton. The Section winner is a lovely looking and power house handling chequer cock raced on Baby Hood a system formulated by myself and Rich Thomas from Portsmouth who I speak to most days as we keep other on the ball as it is very easy to forget simple things in pigeon racing.

He was bred by my good friend Billy Norman out of a pair of birds on loan from me as when I lend birds out I always like a young bird out of them and unfortunately the nest mate was taken by Percy the peregrine at Billy Norman's loft. The parents of them are Leo Heremans with the sire being a Grandson of the "OLYMPIAD 003" and the dam being a double Grand daughter of "BLAUWE LEO" the back bone of the Van den Bulcks family of pigeons. It is the first year breeding from the hen but the cock has previously bred multiple fed winners and breeder buyer winners for other fanciers.

The birds are fed my own mix of corn made up from corn from Naturel Granen & Vanrobaeys with P40 pellets and Homoform added at certain times of the week. In the water they get the Avioform products.

Road training is most days as due to Percy the peregrine my young birds don't go out around the loft after the first training toss.

The young cock is now called "WIND CHEATER" and has had 3 weeks of fantastic and hard races with the wind and odds mostly against him.

From 140 miles from the North he was one of 3 birds together to take 123 in the club and 13th14th 16th in the Solent Fed 1,152 birds against the wind with a minimum of 15 miles west of the fed sending 95% of the birds.

Two days later he was 2nd Open 120 miles from the west a totally different direction in the Watchfield Breeder Buyer race winning over £2500.

Last week from 165 miles north he was one of 7 birds together taking 3rd 4th 5th 6th 7th 8th 9th in the Solent Fed 852 birds where my team of 7 birds dragged back a batch of around 40 home with them.

Then this week he was on his own taking 1st Open Classic and 1st Section A in the BBC against the wind being one of the most west flyers in the section.

We sent a team of 15 birds with 13 home on the day so very happy with the race. So 4 races in 3 weeks north and west.

Big thanks to Martin Attrill for taking my young birds to the Classic and BBC young bird races this year as this made my life so much easier as Thursdays is one of my busiest days of the week for me.

Jayne and Rich Thomas from Portsmouth and Rod Berry from the Lymington area for help with training my young birds this year when I can't take them myself.

Lee Fribbins from the RP magazine for his advice and doing my droppings and swab test after a disastrous start to the young bird racing. A highly recommended super fast service.



After the old bird season they were all paired and allowed to have an open loft. Training was done with the young birds and the first three races sent as trainers with the Southampton South Road Fed, then Ilkeston with the CSCFC where they achieved 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Section 5^{th} and 8^{th} Open. They were then prepared for Ilkeston with the BBC where they were 1^{st} and 2^{nd} Open. I then gave them a week off to prepare for Wakefield where they were 6^{th} Open. I feel the effort to race these hens has been rewarded and now gives me a better base to choose pairs for the following year.
