## Hexham National 1<sup>st</sup> Open 1<sup>st</sup> Section E Mellonby, Knowles & Simpkin

For the trip to Hexham we had a very good entry of 2,916 pigeons, sent by the three Clubs:- BBC 134 members sending 1,547 birds, CSCFC 130 members 1,490 birds and BICC 93 members 1,078 birds. Taking out the duplications from one club to another it gave us the total of 2,916 birds on board.

This race was probably the most challenging the birds had to face so far this season with a breezy west south westerly blowing. It most certainly has set them up with plenty of time on the wing in preparation for the longer races to come. (*Race Advisor – Roger Hurst*) Birds liberated at 6.30am in to sunshine and light fluffy clouds and a fresh West South West breeze. They split in to 2 batches heading South East.

On route you have sunny intervals with moderate South West winds becoming West South West the further down country they go.

Thank you to all the marking stations for your continued service and hard work week after week, which without you we would not survive.

As race details are changing all the time, it is not always possible to include these changes in the BHW or RP in time for them to happen. If you could please keep an eye on "Latest News" on the website and try to inform any members who you know does not have access to the internet, thank you.

Congratulations to our winning trio Mellonby, Knowles & Simpkin of Bridlington 1<sup>st</sup> Open 1<sup>st</sup> Section E. Kerry Mellonby, Colin Simpkin and Stewart Knowles of Bridlington had an absolute field day from Hexham probably taking the first 10 positions in the BBC on their first ever attempt. The winner a Yearling Romain Klein x Premier Stud Geerinkx hen flown on the round about system already a previous winner. Our team of 24 were switched straight from the south to north with no training, a dream start for the partnership.

Stewart knowles of Widnes does the breeding Kerry and Colin do the racing. We would like to thank all party's involved in making these races possible, a special thank you to Harry Jackson at the Carlton marking station.

I clocked a yearling chequer cock after four hours and forty one minutes for the 209 mile flight from Hexham, two weeks previous he won Whitby at 146 miles. On return from Hexham, he was fresh as a daisy and all the birds returned in good condition, he was flown on the chaos system, he was bred by Team May, Darren tells me he's bred from the Geeloger and National Wonder blood of Vermerbergan Wilms, he's full brother to four separate Fed winners.

We had a good day in the Norwich area. We are all very impressed with club and look forward to sending in the Perth race in two weeks. I would once again like to thank David for executing the plan to perfection, having the birds in super order, but moreover this last week because I was in Turkey all week with my family but had the pleasure of watching the pigeon drop on the cameras just before the plane took off.

The first pigeon, a red yearling hen GB21X04770 has never shown before this race but was a firm favourite who I knew just needed the right race because she is perfect in every way and her siblings over the years have been prolific for me so I was confident she would one day repay her corn bill. Both her parents were bred for me by James Dutton of J&G Dutton, the hen is a mix of James' super Alex Docx and Lambrecht families, thank you to James for supplying me with the best pigeons and advice. The sire to my hen is quickly turning into one of my best breeders, winners every year, he is a son of "552" one of Alex Docx base breeders, the dam is from GB15A05788 a son of the number 1 cock (Blauwe Witpen x 720 hen) when paired to Lady Quievrain one of Duttons best hens when he was paired to "The Class Hen" which is the mother to the "Coventry Cock".

The race and day was a lot harder than I expected and I have some good pigeons missing but I am very pleased with the performance and look forward to the Perth race in two weeks.

**Graham and Michael Britton (G V & W Britton) of Peterborough 7<sup>th</sup> Open.** It gives us great pleasure in winning our first ever 1<sup>st</sup> Section in the BBC in our 3<sup>rd</sup> race with the Club. After an interesting start with the Young Birds last year (over 6 hours) for our first bird to fly Wakefield (87miles) it gave us great enjoyment to see our 2 year old Blue Chequer Cock GB20X0701 had pulled out of the main batch of pigeons this time and head over from the A1 just where we thought we needed to see a pigeon come from. Unfortunately after putting in such a sterling effort he hit the loft roof & gave us our worst trap of the year deciding that he needed a long rest before entering the loft! Thankfully even if he had gone straight in we wouldn't have beaten the Open Winner at Bridlington.

Our winning pigeon is from the last son that we have of our NRCC Thurso Open winner (please see image attached) crossed with an Eric Ceuleman sprint pigeon that was a top performer for Tony Woolsley before he packed up racing.
