St Philbert OB2 National 1st Open 1st Section J John & Theresa Gladwin & Jarvis of Leigh On Sea

This weekend saw a first in pigeon racing The UK Masters Race. The BBC, BICC, CSCFC & NFC for the first time in their history held a combined race from St Philbert Du Peuple on Saturday 2nd July. All organisation's will be publishing their own separate race result but to make it more exciting a UK Masters result will be published too. On board the 3 transporters which made their way to St Philbert was 5,475 birds. This race allowed members to cross nominate from one club to another which meant potentially they could be entered in four races within the four Clubs. The BBC entry was 1,297 birds from 92 members (1249 birds duplicated from the NFC & BICC).

I have been asked by many people to say a big thank you to everyone involved at the marking stations for the non stop work you all did putting the birds through, also the many fanciers who brought up van load of birds to the different marking stations. Without you all I don't know where we would be, but you are a credit to the pigeon world. We thank you.

Liberation: The NFC, BICC, CSCFC & BBC convoy was liberated at 07:30. The birds cleared the site immediately in a northerly direction under blue skies. Weather on route almost clear blue skies all the way to the channel. The channel is clear and visibility 11 miles plus. Weather over England shows a weak weather front moving across the country from west to east carrying some light patchy rain which is fizzling out as it does so. Winds mainly light S/W over the complete flight path.

The dam is one of these and was not paired until 2021 breeding our winner in her first year.

Our winner is now called Sophie Boy after my youngest daughter.

This cock bird is bred by famous Dutch fanciers Martijn and Buck De Kruijf and he has been an outstanding pigeon being the

winner of 1st Club 1st Fed Truro 1820b, 3rd Open NFC Sennon Cove (2) 3575b, 5th Open NFC Sennon Cove (1) 5479b. He was gifted to me by Martijn and Buck, and along with a number of stock pigeons we have from them they have been very successful. Buck Rogers is bred from Stevie Wonder Jnr winner of 3rd Arras 1350b, 3rd Roye 694b, 4th Peronne 1477b, 7th Bourges 922b etc from S Smits bred from a full brother to 1st National La Soutteriane 21,271b and a sister to the dam of Faberge 1st National Chateauroux 45589b. His mother is NL17/004 from a direct son of Pitbull 777 of Kerel Leanens and Litchje, sister Olympic Bolt when paired to "127" from Leo Heremans dam of 1st Pom 5296b, 1st Duffel 427b, 2nd Asse 1443b, 2nd Pom 569b, etc, a dtr of "Blauwe As" 1st Asduif Hafo and De 802, dam of 5 x 1st. He is flown on traditional widowhood and fed on Beyers and Country Wide corns.
